Dear Praying Brethren,

We trust this letter finds you doing well in the work of the Lord. Our time for the past two months was spent mostly in Pensacola, FL with our home church. The opportunity to be under the preaching and teaching of my pastors, Bro. Donovan, and Bro. Colvin, has been truly refreshing. We have also had the chance to participate in our church's street preaching ministry. Every Saturday afternoon, between 80 to 100 men step out on the street corners of Pensacola and, while holding Bibles and scripture signs, preach the Gospel. Having a part in this ministry is an immense privilege but also comes with a great responsibility to continue the work in Spain, where we will not have 100 men standing with us.

In April, we were able to attend a mission conference in Texas. It was a time of good fellowship and preaching. At the conference, we met the Writsel family on the tail end of their deputation for Spain. The fellowship was a blessing and, we are looking forward to future fellowship in Spain.

Also, while at the mission's conference, I met a young man who had previously gone to the church and was saved as a child but had since been in the world. After attending a couple of services, he had a burden for his best friend who was lost. His friend came to one of the services and ended up getting saved! Although I did not have a part in his conversation, after the service, both guys needed a ride back to where they lived, nearly an hour away. I was able to help them out and during the drive, the Lord giving me wisdom, I gave them my testimony and tried to encourage both to focus on their relationship with Jesus Christ. As the conversation progressed, they opened up about their backgrounds and the troubles they have gone through. Both these guys are 16 years old and by this age, have dealt with more trouble and heartache than I have seen during my entire life. While I pray that the conversation was a help to them, I left it feeling acutely aware of just how good my upbringing was. The advantage and blessing of growing up in a Christian home cannot be overstated. I am a debtor to my parents for making the effort to raise their children in the nurture and admonition of the Lord. I am also a debtor to my Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, for having mercy on me and keeping me from so many things that could have ruined my life at that age. To protect their privacy, seeing they are both minors, I will not list their names here. I ask that you **pray for these young men** as they have a long road ahead of them and much opposition to their growth as Christians.

Since being back in Pensacola, our activities have consisted primarily of getting our paperwork together for our visas, preparing our personal effects for the move, and spending time with our families. Although eager to get to Spain, we are grateful for the time that the Lord has allowed us to have with our families and church. On the visa front, **we are happy to report that we have a pastor and church willing to help us with our sponsorship paperwork.** The details are still in the works so, I cannot yet give a projected date for our arrival to Spain. However, this is a huge answer to prayer and something that we have been searching for since the beginning of the year. Please pray that the Lord will give us wisdom and that He will order our steps in getting to the field. Thank you for all your prayers and support and, may the Lord bless in you your labors for Him.
