Dear Praying Brethren,

These past two months have brought both challenges and blessings, and we continue to be grateful for God's faithfulness and your generosity through it all. Thank you for your prayers and support, and for being willing to be part of the work here in Spain.

At the beginning of October, we were faced with a series of car problems that all seemed to happen at once. First, the clutch and master cylinder went out, then the starter and the battery. All these repairs were on our only vehicle, and the costs quickly added up. However, several churches sent special offerings during the same period, completely unaware of our situation, and these generous gifts helped offset much of the expense. The car has generally been reliable, but this has led us to consider purchasing a second vehicle with additional seating to help with transportation and ministry logistics.

We have some good news on the visa front: **all our visas have been approved, except for our youngest daughter, Anamelia.** We are still waiting for news about her case, and we have yet to receive any updates in the appeals process. While the new law has caused many problems, one change was positive. **My religious visa has now been approved for four years instead of the expected two.** We appreciate your continued prayers.

Anna was able to attend a ladies' retreat for a good time of fellowship. She was grateful to be able to attend, enjoy good teaching, and spend time with other Christian ladies from across the region.

Later in the month, I traveled to Madrid for a one-day conference on the Spanish Reformation. The sessions focused on the lives of some of the men who labored to translate the scriptures into Spanish while facing the oppression and persecution of the Roman Catholic church. Taking the high-speed train from Barcelona, I was there and back in about twenty-four hours. The following day, a Sunday, I was scheduled to preach the Spanish service in the morning. Since we also had our English service planned for that evening, **Bro. Joe** was able to preach it to help ease the load after the busy weekend. I am very thankful for his willingness and capacity to step in and serve.

One of the highlights of November was our **Thanksgiving service**, which we held here at the church. We had around sixty people in attendance, with some first-time visitors. It was a wonderful evening, with a full spread of American-style Thanksgiving food, special music, a short message, and a time of testimonies afterward. I want to give special recognition to **Anna** for preparing a Thanksgiving feast for sixty people, and to some of the young ladies who stepped in to help her. America exports so much garbage to the rest of the world, so it was nice to celebrate something of the culture that is God-honoring. It was an excellent opportunity to preach the gospel to people we would not have otherwise reached, and many folks said the service was a real blessing to them.

Thank you once again for your continued prayers and faithful support. As we close out 2025 and look over all that the Lord has done, we cannot help but be in awe at His grace to use the base things of this world for His glory. We are grateful to each of you and count it a privilege to labor here on your behalf.
