Numerous churches in this part of the country are having to walk the delicate line of subjecting themselves to the powers that be while still obeying the Lord's leading for their ministries. After one of our meetings in WA, while at a gas station, I had the opportunity to speak with a woman sitting in a car next to the pump. She was waiting at the gas station for her husband, who, when he arrived, also listened to the Gospel for a few minutes but then made it clear that it was time for them to leave. This desire led to him and his family creating "Blessing Bags", small bags with daily essentials for the homeless. All told, we were able to pass out about 50 bags containing some snacks, water, warm clothing items (hats, socks, and mittens), and, most importantly, a copy of John & Romans with a Gospel tract. Handing these out allowed me to speak with several people about their souls and some had a solid profession of faith.
