Dear Praying Brethren,

The highlight of November was, without a doubt, the Thanksgiving service we held with the English ministry of the church. Over fifty people attended, including several lost people and their families. The meal featured traditional American dishes, introducing many to “foreign” items like stuffing and cranberry sauce. Before the meal, I preached a short message about Thanksgiving, tying it into giving thanks for our greatest blessing, salvation. After this, we sang some hymns, and as the meal concluded, we had a time of testimonies in both English and Spanish. The Lord’s guidance and providence were evident in the planning, preparation, and presentation, and we do not doubt that your prayers played a part. Since then, some have also visited the regular Spanish services. The Lord is clearly working, and we ask that you join us in praying that the Lord will bless the seeds that have been sown.

Right after the Thanksgiving service, we had the blessing of having Anna’s grandfather, Jack, visit us for a few weeks. We asked you to pray for him at the beginning of last year. He was diagnosed with cancer around that time, and for a while, the prognosis was not great. However, due in no small part to your prayers, he felt well enough to fly across the Atlantic and visit us for nearly two weeks. We showed him around, introduced him to our friends and brethren here, and enjoyed the time of fellowship with him. We cannot thank the Lord enough for His grace and mercy, and we wish to thank you all for your prayers for him and his health. The last update we have received is that the cancer is in remission, but he is still dealing with some intense side effects from the treatment. Please pray that the Lord will continue to heal him, and thank you again for praying!

After Anna’s grandfather left, we all came down with a run of sicknesses that lasted nearly a month. Unfortunately, due to the timing and intensity of the illnesses, much of our evangelism plans for the holidays had to be canceled. Despite all this, we were able to print a small Christmas-themed tract that we helped design last year, several thousand copies of which were distributed in the towns around the church.

In our last letter, we asked you to pray that the Lord would open doors with our neighbors. Space and privacy concerns prevent us from sharing the details, but Lord has tremendously answered this request on multiple occasions. Please continue to keep this item on your prayer list. The Lord is listening!

In January, I was able to work with the homeless mission again. The brother who heads it up asked me to preach for one of the groups coming in. With God’s help, I preached a short and simple Gospel message in Spanish. Afterward, I spoke with a young man from France named **Antoine**. He did not speak much Spanish but could communicate somewhat in English. He listened intently and admitted that he was unsure he believed in the resurrection. Clearly, the Lord was working on him, but he was still trying to process it all. Please pray for him and the others who heard the Gospel or received tracts.

In closing, we want to thank all of you who so generously showed your love and care for us over the holidays. Each Christmas card and note sent was a great encouragement, and we cannot thank you all enough for the generous love offerings given. Thank you so much for thinking of our family, and please know that your kindness makes a difference.
